Letter from the Chairman

As the current chairman of ORCS my primary responsibility is to organize and run the 22nd biennial conference of the Organic Reactions Catalysis Society and work has already begun. The ORCS web site has been moved to a new ISP and has been updated with more additions in progress. Details for the 2008 meeting have been added including links to The Jefferson Hotel. I am very excited about this venue and think those attending the 2008 meeting will be happy with the hotel and meeting spaces.

I have been a member of ORCS since 1984 and feel a great responsibility in leading the Society for the next two years. The previous chairmen have run very successful scientific meetings and I will make every effort to make the 22nd Conference even better.

organic chemistry. My primary responsibility is to find good work on catalysis in organic chemistry and get the scientists to agree to come to the meeting and present their work.

The next important function of the meetings is to not only provide the opportunity for but to actively encourage the interaction among the attending scientists. The single session design of the meetings was planned partially for this reason. The extended breaks were designed more to encourage and provide time for discussions about the presentations than for time to drink and eat. Our members are involved in basic research, applied research, development and manufacturing of organic reactions using catalysis and the vendor industries that provide the catalysts as well as the equipment that allow the experiments to be run from small lab scale to industrial processes. The ability to meet and talk face to face gives each of us a chance to learn from other scientists in the field in a very efficient manner. The professional contacts made are invaluable to most of us in our careers; and, I think, most if not all of our current and former ORCS members have benefited from this close association with others who share our passion for catalysis. Few other organizations that I am aware of have so many highly talented and successful members who are anxious and willing to talk to the newest members as well as the old regulars and provide insights and suggestions when asked. This triumvirate of academic chemist, industrial chemists and vendors provides the strength of our organization and we need to be vigilant that all three sectors benefit from our meetings.

Please welcome and support our new committee members: Mr. Steve Quimby (Webmaster), Dr. Baoshu Chen (Director), Prof. Bert Chandler (Director), Dr. Jim White (Director) and Prof. Pierre Gallezot (Non-North American Director). We have been asked to pick a point contact person between ORCS and the European Catalysis Groups and Dr. Steve Schmidt (Past Chairman) has agreed to serve in this capacity.

On behalf of all of ORCS I thank our outgoing members: Dr. John Sowa, Dr. Yongkui Sun, Dr. Anne Gafney and Prof. Angelo Vaccari. Your service, enthusiasm and hard work will be missed.

I will close with two thoughts. We have had twenty one successful ORCS conferences. The Executive Committee and I will work as hard as possible to make the 22nd Conference a highly successful meeting but we do face some challenges. Attendance and presentations by industrial chemists has declined at recent meetings and we need to reverse this trend. I need your help in identifying potential industrial presentations, convincing these scientists that discussing their work at ORCS will benefit them, their science and their companies and getting them to submit abstracts.

I also need your ideas and comments on ORCS. What do you get from ORCS, what do you want in the future from ORCS, what does ORCS do well, in what areas can ORCS improve? ORCS Conferences – How Good a Value?

What did ORCS members get for their \$450 registration fee in Orlando?

- Fifty nine scientific presentations on catalysis in organic synthesis by world class scientists
- A two year membership in ORCS
- A two year membership in the North American Catalysis Society
- The registration reception on Sunday evening
- Six drink/snack breaks during the presentations
- The ORCS banquet on Monday evening
- A box lunch on Tuesday
- A hard bound copy of the proceedings of the conference

When you add up the fair market value of these benefits, the total is far more than the registration fee. How do we do this?

22nd ORCS Conference

Paul Rylander and Murray Raney Awards

The Beginning

The first four meetings of what was to become ORCS were sponsored and held from 1966 - 1972 by The New York Academy of Sciences and were titled "Conference on Catalytic Hydrogenation and Analogous Pressure Reactions". Joseph O'Connor (Ciba Pharmaceutical), Morris Freifelder (Abbott Laboratories) and Melvin Rubenstorf (The Upjohn Company) were Co-Chairmen of the first conference.

According to Dr. O'Connor: Morris Friefelder and Bill Pearlman (Parke-Davis) brought together a group of chemists who had been seriously concerned about the lack of a forum to publicize and discuss the practical aspects of catalysis in organic chemistry. This group included Dale Blackburn (Smith Kline & French), Jack Campbell (Eli Lilly), Bill Jones (Merck), Mel Rubenstorf, Paul Rylander (Engelhard), Bill Selby (G. D. Searle), Dave Wagner (Hoffman LaRoche) and Joe O'Connor. The result of these discussions was the 1st Conference held by the Academy. (Based on "Opening Remarks", Ann. N.Y. Acad. Sci., Vol. **145** (1967))

A remarkable fact about these four meetings is that The Academy had a policy of sponsoring no more than two meetings on the same topic so the Academy's leaders must have felt these meetings served a very useful scientific purpose. After the fourth meeting, ORCS was formed to continue these national meetings on catalysis separate from the New York Academy of Sciences. The 5th Conference was organized by ORCS and was held in Boston in 1975.

Did You Know?

Current ORCS member, former ORCS Chairman, long time ORCS leader and Rylander award winner Dr. Robert L. Augustine of The Center for Applied Catalysis presented the second paper at the first meeting in New York. Yes we still have at least one member who has attended every ORCS meeting.
